Dates to Remember

Immediately: When you receive your package of science project papers, place them in a special pocket folder.

1. Label your folder: "Science Project"
2. Keep all your science project papers, notes, research, data, graphs, etc. in this one special folder.
3. Start your log. This is a detailed list of everything you do for your project. A spiral notebook works well. See the enclosed handout for an example.
4. Start looking for an experiment which you can conduct at home. The school library has several books which can help you. The public library may also contain helpful books. The Internet may also be useful.
